Biography

Professor Cheng Li is Director and Senior Fellow at the Brookings Institution's John L Thornton China Center. He is also a director of the National Committee on U.S.-China Relations, a distinguished fellow at the University of Toronto's Munk School of Global Affairs and Public Policy a nonresident fellow at Yale University's Paul Tsai China Center, and a member of the Council on Foreign Relations. He received an MA in Asian Studies from the University of California at Berkeley and a PhD in Political Science from Princeton University.

He is the author and editor of 17 books, including more *recently* *Chinese Politics in the Xi Jinping Era: Reassessing Collective Leadership* (2016), *The Power of Ideas: The Rising Influence of Thinkers and Think Tanks in China* (2017), and *Middle Class Shanghai: Reshaping U.S.-China Engagement* (2021). He is currently completing a book manuscript with the working title *Xi Jinping's Protégés: Rising Elite Groups in the Chinese Leadership*.
