Biography

Dr Chenhong Peng is the Assistant Professor in the Department of Social Work and Social Administration at the University of Hong Kong. Dr Peng's research interests are in social policy and are guided by three questions: What are the variations in social policy design and development? What are the forces driving social policy variations? What are the effects of social policy on people's well-being and behaviors? Within the social policy, her primary areas of interest are poverty and social protection policy. She has investigated the determinants of poverty, poverty dynamics, intergenerational poverty, and subjective poverty in Hong Kong. She is currently working on several research projects, including subnational variations in public assistance program (Dibao) in mainland China, social assistance regimes in East Asia, and the determinants and impacts of local migrant housing policy in mainland China. Besides investigating poverty and social protection policy, she also conducts research on old-age income protection policy and migration policy. Her research goal is to enhance evidence-based social policymaking.
